A 1955 portrait by Salvador Dali of Dolores Suero Falla, Carlos de la Cruz's mother, inspired the 2010 - 2011 exhibition. Inspired by Surrealism and covering a broad stylistic and conceptual range of works, this year's installation will establish a dialogue between Dali's portrait and a selection of works from the collection.

The de la Cruz Collection Contemporary Art Space, located in Miami's Design District opened in December 2009 during Art Basel Miami Beach.
